Method

- 1. Tell the children that they need to catch the Gingerbread Man.
- 2. Can they make a trap to catch him?
- 3. They can only use the resources that you have left out for them.
- 4. Look at the trap examples you have and talk about how they might work to catch the Gingerbread Man.
- 5. Allow the children time to design and make their trap.
- 6. Once the children have made their traps allow them to explain to you and the group how their trap will work.

You will need:

A selection of card and paper

Children's scissors

Sticky tape

Sticks

Pipe cleaners

Leaves

Netting — e.g. from a bag of oranges or punnet of fruit.
